Friends,

This week we are keeping the Fourth Sunday after Trinity.

You will have received, I hope, the mailing letting you know that as of tomorrow, the church is open for public worship. As I noted, there will be services at 8am (BCP Holy Eucharist) and 10.30am (Holy Eucharist, with sermon). It will be a joy to welcome people back in church, but it will be a bit of a challenge to make sure we are able to keep proper physical distancing, essential hygiene and so on, while we worship. The guidance on how to conduct worship will be adhered to, and so the services will look and feel different, not least

because we cannot sing in church yet and there will be no music at all this week, and we won't be able to gather after the service as we would like. However, we will worship together, and share the eucharist together, and that will I hope be a blessing to those who come.

Meanwhile, we also know that some of our congregation won't be in church this week for one reason or another.
