

COVID 19 and lockdown The most recent directive from the government has taken us back into a state of lockdown until 2 December, with the closure of places of worship once again. It is of course a great sadness, but we will do what we can to help to stem the rate of infection in our parish and beyond. Sunday worship is therefore suspended until the 6 December.

We will continue to meet via the podcast during this period, and are grateful to John Ward and Jane Ellard for their hard work putting it together week by week.

This Sunday is Remembrance Sunday This week's podcast will include the Act of Remembrance and two minutes' silence. Even though we cannot gather together, we can worship wherever we find ourselves, and know our prayers are joining those of others doing the same thing. The podcast will include the Act of Remembrance, and the Two Minutes' Silence. Call to prayer As a second lockdown in England comes into force, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York are inviting Christians across the nation to participate in a month of prayer.

Prayers at 6pm

- Christians are encouraged to pray daily for a specific area of national concern, wherever they are, culminating in a collective moment of prayer at 6pm each evening
- We are calling Christians in the diocese of London to pray on your doorstep for your neighbourhood, and also for the National prayer points:
 - *Sunday – Family, friends and loved ones*
 - *Monday – Schools and colleges, children and young people*
 - *Tuesday – Elderly, isolated and vulnerable*
 - *Wednesday – Businesses, the workplace and economic wellbeing*
 - *Thursday – The NHS and other key workers*
 - *Friday – National and local governments*

- *Saturday – All who are grieving and all suffering with physical and mental ill-health*
- We (along with churches across the country) will be ringing our bell at 6pm each evening, as a sign of our prayer. Why not light a candle in your window, or carry one onto your doorstep to let people know you are praying wherever you are?.

Bishop of Kensington's Teaching Evenings 2020 Tuesday 23 November and Monday 7 December. Our Bishop has been committed to offering Deanery Teaching Evenings for all lay people in the past years, on issues such as Prayer, the Problem of Evil and, most recently, Brexit. This year the theme is Freedom, and Bishop Graham will be speaking on the topic: 'What is True Freedom?' He says,
"Freedom is one of the big ideas of our culture. We long for it, fight wars over it and guard our freedoms jealously. Some have even seen the imposition of restrictions

during the pandemic as an infringement of civil liberties. Christian faith also speaks of freedom, yet in ways that can seem strange, with ideas such as obedience to the will of God, and the value of service. What, then, is a Christian understanding of freedom and how does it differ from secular ideas?" During this evening, with opportunity for questions and interaction, Bishop Graham will explore how a Christian understanding of freedom can be truly liberating.

This year's Teaching Evening is open to everyone, clergy and laity, and will be an excellent time to think together about how our Christian faith works out in practice through one of the most important ideas of our time.
